Historian: Update our history from our members, who lived it.




Quartermaster: Maintain, inventory and invent new and on board items of and for the Association "Ships Store;"

Shark Tales!



During my second tour in VP-6, I was selected for transfer to COMPATWINGTWO as staff maintenance officer and to assume the duties of COMFAIRHAWAII maintenance officer due to the disestablishment of that command without transfer of the maintenance responsibilities. While assigned there, my staff and I developed several maintenance facilities and procedures that increased Full System Readiness of all assigned squadrons to levels above all other patrol squadrons. This required many hours of extra duty of my staff, and I became very upset and disgusted with the poor design, manufacture and support of too many systems.

This resulted in me writing a Weapons Systems Development paper which I titled THE ODYSSEY of INTRODUCTION. This paper was a critique and criticism of the Department of Defense and Department of the Navy about the unsatisfactory (in my opinion) way the introduction of new weapons systems were managed. As you might expect the "Big Brass" came after me with the intent on pounding me into the ground and ending my career. This turned out to be a milestone in my career. My paper identified reasons for poor operational performance of new weapons systems and recommended organizational design, personnel selection, procedural methods, production management and logistical changes to prevent these deficiencies. To make it short, they found out I was correct and could prove it. So instead of ending my career they selected me for management and development of a new weapons system, the strike fighter FA-18 Hornet.



The F/A-18 Hornet was developed to replace the former F-4 Phantom fighter with a maintenance man hour per flight hour of 58 man hours and the A-7E Corsair II attack aircraft with a maintenance man hour per flight hour of 28 man hours. As a result of the maintainability and reliability performance of the F/A-18 strike fighter, maintenance man-hours per flight hour were reduced by over 80%. This reduction directly relates to billions of dollars of savings for the Defense Department. This aircraft became the holder of just about every record an aircraft of this type could have for the ensuing 30 years. After completing this most satisfying assignment, CDR Masters retired with 25 years of military service.
